The representations response was not fully displayed on the GeM portal due to technical error. The detailed point-by-point response to the representation is as follows:

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<p>Certification requirement: Bid ATC requires TCO EPEAT certification to qualify bid. In light of to the above, as per the Department for Promotion of Internal Trade (DPIIT) Office Memorandum No. P-45014/33/2021-BE-ii (e64737) dated December 20, 2022, it has been mandated that any restrictive and discriminatory conditions against local suppliers should not be part of tenders or bids. This directive ensures a fair and equitable opportunity for local manufacturers and suppliers to participate in public procurement processes. Also GOI OM 33(3)/201724.01.2018, also notified that TCO, EPEAT, MI, Energy Star are not relevant to India & due to lack of adequate testing facilities this certification is not complied with by LOEM, and support only MNC brands. This quality certification requirement could be fulfilled by Indian quality certifications such as BEE, BIS and EPR. 6. Mandating submission of documents in physical form as a pre-requisite to qualify bidders.
7. Floating / creation of work contracts as Custom Bids in Services.
8. Seeking sample with bid or approval of samples during bid evaluation process. (However, in bids for [attached categories](#), trials are allowed as per approved procurement policy of the buyer nodal Ministries)
9. Mandating foreign / international certifications even in case of existence of Indian Standards without specifying equivalent Indian Certification / standards.
10. Seeking experience from specific organization / department / institute only or from foreign / export experience.
11. Creating bid for items from irrelevant categories.
12. Incorporating any clause against the MSME policy and Preference to Make in India Policy.
13. Reference of conditions published on any external site or reference to external documents/clauses.
14. Asking for any Tender fee / Bid Participation fee / Auction fee in case of Bids / Forward Auction, as the case may be.

Further, if any seller has any objection/grievance against these additional clauses or otherwise on any aspect of this bid, they can raise their representation against the same by using the Representation window provided in the bid details field in Seller dashboard after logging in as a seller within 4 days of bid publication on GeM. Buyer is duty bound to reply to all such representations and would not be allowed to open bids if he fails to reply to such representations.
